ORDINANCE NO. 2026-05-13-02

AN ORDINANCE CANVASSING THE RESULTS OF THE SPECIAL ELECTION FOR STREET MAINTENANCE SALES AND USE TAX; AND OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREOF; AND SETTING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Olmos Park, Texas called for a Special Election on May 2, 2026 on the following proposition:

PROPOSITION 1

“The reauthorization of the local sales and use tax in the City of Olmos Park, Texas, at the rate of one-fourth of one percent to continue providing revenue for maintenance and repair of municipal streets. The tax expires on the fourth anniversary of the date of this election unless the imposition of the tax is reauthorized.”

and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed and investigated all matters pertaining to this election, including the ordering, notices, election officers, holding, and returns thereof; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Texas Election Code, the City Council, convened on this the 13th day of May 2026, for the purpose of canvassing the vote in the general and special elections held on May 2, 2026;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ACCORDINGLY FOUND, DECLARED, AND RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OLMOS PARK, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. Canvass of Vote – Special Election.

(a) There came to be considered the returns of the special election held on the 2nd day of May, 2026, and finds the following votes cast “FOR” the ballot proposition submitted, and “AGAINST” the following ballot proposition:

PROPOSITION 1

“The reauthorization of the local sales and use tax in the City of Olmos Park, Texas, at the rate of one-fourth of one percent to continue providing revenue for maintenance and repair of municipal streets. The tax expires on the fourth anniversary of the date of this election unless the imposition of the tax is reauthorized.”

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(b) It is found, determined and declared by the City Council that said Special Election was duly called; that notice of said special election was given in accordance with law, returns of the election have been lawfully made by the proper officials, and that said election was held in accordance with law. The above-stated proposition, being submitted to only qualified, resident electors of the City for vote, resulted in more than a MAJORITY of the qualified votes voting at the election having voted FOR the proposition by the number of votes described in Section 4(a) and City Council hereby finds and determines that Proposition 1 carried at the election.

SECTION 5. The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Ordinance for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the City Council.

SECTION 6. All Ordinances or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain controlling as to the matters resolved herein.

SECTION 7. It is officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, was given, all as required by Chapter 551, Texas Government Code.

SECTION 8. This Ordinance will become effective immediately upon its passage by the City Council.
